Our approach

Kenny Waste Management recognises that it is a part of, and has responsibilities towards, the communities it operates in. We want to continue to make a real difference where we can, and this statement sets how will facilitate long lasting change.

We are committed to being a good neighbour and employer, and we offer a range of support to our partners, by providing either waste related services or offering staff skills and expertise. Our focus remains on building relationships with local and national partners, designed to make an positive impact. We believe building partnerships is the greatest way for us to add value to the community and offer the contributions most in need to those organisations addressing key social and environmental issues.

Our focus

We are determined to deliver a balanced mix of community initiatives that add real value for society, for our employees and for the business. We are open to working on a range of projects in response to stakeholder feedback, but we have identified a number priorities enabling us to focus our resources effectively.

- 1. *Employability and Workplace*. We will offer opportunities for people to receive the skills development and training they need to build a career in a rapidly changing workplace.
- 2. *Social Enterprise*. We will offer professional services, funding & leadership development to those Social Enterprises who are addressing issues aligned with our own priorities.
- 3. <u>Health & Wellbeing</u>. We all need a little help to reach our full potential, and some of us have physical and mental wellbeing challenges that make it even harder. We are determined to level out inequalities, tackle stigmas and encourage everyone to be help others succeed.
- 4. <u>Environmental education</u>. Supporting schools, colleges and universities to encourage students to develop their understanding of waste & recycling, offer insights into the future workplace and inspire them to reach their potential.

Our approach

The social value we can add is maximised when we all work together. Our approach contributes to strengthening our relationships with a range of stakeholders, including customers, suppliers, residents, and employees. Importantly, it also increases the impact we can achieve.

We have formal procedures for deciding how our community investment should be targeted, and we measure and report on progress. All investment and engagement in community-based initiatives is informed by our four priorities and is directed through three main routes.

- Charity partners we support both national and local charities. We help charities to meet their goals, through fundraising, by the provision of our skills and experience as well as other in-kind support. In turn we gain an insight into societal challenges and how by supporting charities we can make a positive difference.
- In-Kind Support as a leading national waste management expert, we understand that often the removal waste from a project can burdensome. We work with organisations reduce the cost and complexity of waste removal
- Volunteering our team really enjoy becoming involved in community projects, and we have an employee
 volunteer scheme designed to support a charity or community groups. This donation of time and skills is
 often priceless to local groups, as well as helping colleagues develop professional and personal skills that are
 valuable in the workplace. We offer guidance for colleagues on how they can volunteer and how to provide
