

DIVERSION, WASTE RECOVERY & WASTE RECYCLING POLICY

It is the policy of the Company to constantly strive to find new, innovative, economic and environmentally sustainable solutions to the recovery, recycling and diversion from landfill of all waste materials that we receive.

We take the impact of waste on the environment very seriously and place great emphasis on sourcing the best solution for each waste type we receive.

We are constantly exploring the possibilities that new technologies can provide, and we partner and supply a myriad of secondary manufacturers and consumers of secondary commodities to ensure that all materials that can have a second life as recycled products are re-used to that end after significant further processing. We supply secondary/recovered materials that have been sorted/graded and re-processed to a number of UK businesses to ensure that the products are re-used in the UK, creating and sustaining UK jobs.

We place great emphasis on the reduction of waste sent to landfill and we carry out our obligations in this respect by sourcing alternatives to landfill.

Where materials are identified as having no further secondary use and as such cannot be re-used, we supply those materials to others in a format whereby they can be used as an RDF (Refused Derived Fuel) to create renewable energy.

The above route eliminates the landfilling of those materials and supports our corporate aim of being a Zero Landfill Waste Manager through 2012 and onwards.

We recover and divert from landfill secondary products such as: Aggregates, wood, metal, paper fibre, textiles, plastics & mineral fractions.

All of the above waste products are re-used by UK companies in order to re-supply consumers with everyday products.

The re-use of secondary products avoids the use of virgin materials such as minerals, crude oil and trees which are a scarce and valuable resource environmentally.
